#### **ADVOCACY FOR A NATIONAL SCHOOL FOOD PROGRAM**

This past year we partnered with The Coalition for Healthy School Food - the largest school food network in Canada to support advocacy efforts for a National School Food Program. The premise is that all children should have access to healthy food at school and we wanted the Federal Government to fulfill their 2019 election promise to initiate a National School Food Program. While we don't yet have the details about what the National School Food Program will look like and mean locally, we look forward to working with all levels of government as well as our education and community partners to support implementing the program in Ottawa schools.

#### **TEST PILOTING NEW GARDENING TECHNOLOGY**







This past school year, our Classroom Gardens Program piloted a new revolutionary smart indoor garden at a local High School. The technology was developed by NASA to grow plants in space, and now students have a unique opportunity to engage with cutting-edge agricultural technology, paving the way for a greener, edible, sustainable future.


#### SUPPORTING HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS


All funds we receive from our generous community, partners and donors are accounted for and put towards furthering our mission to help Ottawa's children and youth succeed.

#### **REVENUE BY FUNDING**




Total Revenue: \$5,007,679

#### **EXPENSES BY PROGRAM**




#### **OPERATING EXPENSES**
